• **GAME OF THE WEEK - BCSP No. 8 Bethune-Cookman** and BCSP No. 7 **Grambling State** staged a see-saw game for the ages, going back and forth in the fourth quarter before B-CU emerged with a scintillating 56-53 win over the Tigers at Eddie Robinson Stadium in Grambling. This was the real *MEAC/SWAC Challenge*.

The teams combined for 1,047 yards and 109 points and traded ten lead changes, six in the final quarter. The game was tied at 14 at the half and B-CU (1-1, 0-0 MEAC) led 28-24 entering the final quarter. That's when the fireworks began.

Grambling (0-2, 0-0 SWAC) scored 15 unanswered points to begin the period - a sack of QB **Larry Brihm** for a safety, two field goals and a TD after a fumble recovery deep in B-CU territory - and went up 39-28 with 11:19 to play. B-CU starting QB **Quentin Williams** then re-entered the game and threw two of his three fourth-quarter TD passes to put B-CU up 41-39 with 7:34 to play. A minute-and-a-half later **Martez Carter** put Grambling up 46-41 on a 35-yard TD run. Ninety seconds later, Williams hit **Jawill Davis** from 28 yards out for Davis's second TD of the period and B-CU led 49-46 with 3:37 left. B-CU running back **Anthony Jordan** scored what appeared to be the clincher when he ran in from 41 yards out to put the Wildcats up 56-46 with 1:48 left. But Grambling QB **Johnathan Williams** led the G-Men on a 61-yard, six-play drive in 50 seconds to pull within 56-53 on a 12-yard TD pass to **Chester Rogers** with :54 seconds left.

The ensuing onside kick went out of bounds and B-CU was able to run out the clock.

From all appearances, this is not your old Bethune-Cookman (under former head coach **Brian Jenkins**) that would run the ball over and over again. Williams completed 17 of 22 passes for 244 yards - 12 of 14 in the fourth quarter - and the three fourth-quarter scores while Brihm completed 17 of 26 passes for 219 yards and three TDs. Davis, a 5-11 redshirt sophomore from Miami, hauled in eight passes for 199 yards and two TDs, three for 96 yards and both TDs in the fourth quarter, to lead the Wildcats.

Grambling QB **Johnathan Williams** completed 30 of 47 passes for 326 yards and three TDs with one pick and ran for 61 yards and one score. GSU wideout **Chad Williams** had 11 receptions for 140 yards and one TD.

This was Bethune-Cookman's first-ever win over Grambling in 11 tries and the first career win for first-year head coach **Terry Sims**.

- **BCSP No. 10 TUSKEGEE** - Tuskegee scored twice in the fourth-quarter to break from a 14-14 tie and post a dramatic 27-14 win over **SIAC** rival **Albany State** Saturday in the *White Water Classic* in Phenix City, Alabama.

Tuskegee (2-0, 0-0 SIAC W) scored on a 79-yard pass play from quarterback **Kevin Lacey** to **Van Powell** to go up 20-14 with 10:07 left. After the teams exchanged possessions, Albany State (0-2, 0-0 SIAC E), starting from its 35, drove to the Tuskegee 10 with :30 seconds to play. That's when Tuskegee linebacker **Ricky Norris** stepped in front of a pass from ASU QB **Caleb Edmonds** and returned it

95-yards for the clinching score.

Tuskegee led 14-0 early on a Lacey to **Marquel Gardner** TD pass and a 73-yard blocked field goal return by **Jewell Ratliff** early in the second quarter. ASU tied the score at 14 on two short second-quarter TD runs (5, 2) by **Jarvis Small**.

- **BCSP No. 6 SOUTHERN** - WR/KR **Willie Quinn** scored on a 39-yard punt return and a 90-yard kickoff return and threw an 89-yard TD pass to **Randall Menard** as the Jaguars (1-1, 1-0 SWAC W) downed **Mississippi Valley State** 50-13 Thursday night.

The Jaguars got two scoring runs (14, 10) from RB **Lenard Tillery** to open the scoring while QB **Austin Howard** completed 10 of 14 passes for 150 yards without a pick including a 28-yard second-quarter scoring pass to **Nico Talbert**.

Quinn, a 5-5, 145-pound junior, finished with 187 all-purpose yards and now has four punt returns and three kickoff returns for TDs in his career. He had a 100-yard kickoff return TD last week vs. Louisiana Tech.

- **ELIZABETH CITY STATE** - The Vikings (2-0, 0-0 CIAA N) got two TD passes from starting QB **Daquan Neal** (12-18-0, 163 yards) and two more from back-up QB **Jaquez Riles** (3-4-0, 86 yards) in a 55-0 shutout of **Benedict** (0-2, 0-0 SIAC E).

The ECSU defense held Benedict to 168 yards, picked off four passes, scored on a 29-yard fumble return and had three sacks.

- **BCSP No. 5 ALCORN STATE** - QB **John Gibbs Jr.** returned to form hitting on 26 of 33 passes for 305 yards and one TD and ran for another score as the Braves (1-1, 1-0 SWAC E) shut out **Alabama State** (0-2, 0-1 SWAC E) after giving up 14 first-quarter points in a 31-14 win.

Gibbs had a 3-yard TD run in the second quarter to tie the score at 14 before **Haiden McRaney's** 29-yard field goal with 1:12 to play gave Alcorn a 17-14 halftime lead.

Darryn Ragsdale scored on a 25-yard run to put the Braves up 24-14 in the third quarter and Gibbs followed with a 62-yard scoring pass to **Tollette George** to cap the scoring.

- **BCSP No. 4 TENNESSEE STATE** - **Tennessee State** (2-0, 0-0 OVC) jumped out in front early and held off **Jackson State** for a 35-25 win, its fourth straight at the *Southern Heritage Classic* in Memphis.

Freshman QB **O'Shay Ackerman-Carter** completed 15 of 25 passes for 250 yards and three TDs that staked the Blue Tigers to a 35-12 lead late in the third quarter. JSU fought back behind QB **Lamontez Ivy** (24-39, 322 yards) who threw a 29-yard TD pass to **Wil Golson** with 1:07 left in the third quarter and another to **James Moll** from nine yards out with 10:21 left to play. JSU got into scoring position again but could not get off a 51-yard field goal attempt with 5:19 left.

Patrick Smith had three catches for 107 yards and TSU's first TD from 64 yards. TSU tailback **Telvin Hooks** had two TD runs (7, 2). JSU WR **Dan Williams** had ten receptions for 173 yards.

- **MORE OF THE SAME!!!** Last week's results against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents were bad, this week's may have been worse. But there were plenty of butt whippings even on the FCS level to go around.

- **BCSP No. 2 North Carolina A&T** and **BCSP No. 3 North Carolina Central** were manhandled by ACC members UNC (53-14 over A&T) and Duke (55-0 over NCCU).

- **HOWARD** and **DELAWARE STATE** - But the worse beatdowns were administered by Boston College (76-0 over **Howard**) and Kent State (45-13 over **DelState**).

The Howard/BC game was subjected to a running clock (slaughter rule, if you will) in the third and fourth quarters after BC led 62-0 at the half. Howard (0-2, 0-0 MEAC) generated 11 yards of total offense, 7 yards rushing and 4 yards passing (2 of 12) on the game.

If you can believe it, DelState (0-2, 0-0 MEAC) was worse. The Hornets managed -33 yards of offense, 5 yards passing (3 of 10) and -38 yards rushing on 26 carries vs. mighty Kent State. Kent State had six sacks for -46 yards.

• **ALSO TAKING IT ON THE CHIN!!!** Again, no reason for Howard, DelState, A&T or Central

to feel like the 'Lone Ranger.'

• **BCSP No. 1 SOUTH CAROLINA STATE** - The Bulldogs (1-1, 0-0 MEAC) fumbled on their first possession leading to a touchdown en route to being humbled by FCS No. 3 Coastal Carolina 41-14. The Chanticleers put up 506 yards (284 rushing, 222 passing) on the supposedly vaunted SCSU defense while grabbing two fumbles and posting a safety on another. The Chanticleers led 32-0 at the half and 41-0 before SC State scored two late TDs.

• **BCSP No. 9 MORGAN STATE** - was humbled by FCS No. 4 Illinois State. The Redbirds won the first half 36-7 and the second half 31-7 en route to a 67-14 win. MSU (0-2, 0-0 MEAC) gave up 513 total yards.

• **WINSTON-SALEM STATE** - The Rams (0-2, 0-0 CIAA), the CIAA South Division favorite, scored first on a 43-yard **William Johnson** field goal and did not score again in falling to Valdosta State, 31-3.

The once-high powered and offensive-minded Rams have now been held to 10 points in two losses to open the season. The Rams and QB **Rod Tinsley** (9-24-0) were held to 46 passing yards. RB **Tyree Massey** rambled for 110 yards on 25 carries to produce the bulk of the offense.

VSU defeated WSSU 35-7 in the 2012 NCAA Div. II championship game.

- **HAMPTON** - The Pirates (1-1, 0-0 MEAC) led Richmond 28-16 entering the fourth quarter but gave up two last period touchdowns to fall 31-28.

QB **David Watford** (17-33-0, 239 yards, 3 TDs) hooked with wideout **Twarm Mixson** six times for 93 yards including a 15-yard connection that put the Pirates up 14-0. Mixson also threw a 15-yard scoring pass to **Rashawn Proctor** to open the scoring. **Shakim Alonzo** caught a 5-yard toss from Watford to give Hampton a 21-7 lead. Proctor caught a 30-yard pass from Watford to give the Pirates a 28-16 lead with 2:42 left in the third period.

After Richmond scored twice to take the lead, Hampton drove into UR territory but turned the ball over on downs. Hampton punted on its ensuing possession and UR salted the game away on a 16-

WORTH NOTING

Players, Stats Worth Watching

- **EXTRA POINT** - Kent State placekicker senior April Goss became the second woman to score in major college football history Saturday against **Delaware State**, making her very first appearance after four years on the team to kick an extra point in the second quarter. When Goss converted the kick, her teammates picked her up and carried her off the field as she received an ovation from the crowd.

- **STYMIED!!** - **South Carolina State** defensive tackle **Javon Hargrave**, the MEAC preseason defensive player of the year who posted 2.5 sacks and 4.5 tackles for losses in the opener vs. **Arkansas-Pine Bluff**, was shutout vs. Coastal Carolina Saturday. He had no tackles, no sacks and just one quarterback hurry. Hargrave is considered the top NFL prospect in the MEAC.

- **THAT'S WHAT I CALL CLOSE!** - **Grambling State** put up 524 yards of total offense while **Bethune-Cookman** put up 523 in their 56-53 shootout. That's a total of 1,047 yards. B-CU attempted 48 passes, Grambling 47.

With B-CU leading 28-24 entering the fourth quarter, B-CU scored 28 fourth-quarter points while GSU scored 29.



- **CRYSTAL BALL** - The *Sporting News College Basketball Annual* will soon be on newstands with my predictions for the 2015-16 basketball seasons in the **Mid Eastern Athletic Conference** and the **Southwestern Athletic Conference**.

Two-time defending SWAC champion **Texas Southern** is my choice to three-peat. The Tigers, under head coach **Mike Davis**, are a budding dynasty in the SWAC. They posted regular season wins over Final Four participant Michigan State and over Kansas State last season. Three starters return and they get back a former starter who sat out last season.

Despite losing tournament MVP **Deron Powers** (transferred to Hofstra), defending tournament champ **Hampton** is the choice in the MEAC. The Pirates return seven of their top eight players from a season ago.
