BIG WINNERS!

• Undefeated BCSP No. 6 **VIRGINIA STATE** (6-0, 4-0 CIAA, 2-0 N) got 234 rushing yards including a 93-yard TD gallop from RB **Trenton Cannon** and 334 total yards and four TDs from QB **Cordell Cook** in knocking off formerly undefeated No. 5 **Bowie State**, 47-35 in the CIAA North showdown at the VSU homecoming.

Cannon, the CIAA's leading rusher, tormented the BSU (6-1, 3-1 CIAA, 1-1 N) defense all day with his scintillating runs, six of which went for double-digits including his 93-yarder late in the first quarter. Cook (13-21-0) threw for 234 yards and two TDs (36, 55) and ran for 100 yards (17 carries) and three scores (3, 6, 55).

The VSU defense battled BSU receivers all day though QB **Amir Hall** threw five touchdown passes (24, 23, 7, 15, 17) and for 281 yards (29-48-1). WR **Brandon Britton** had 11 receptions for 131 yards and 2 scores (7, 15).

• BCSP No. 8 **HAMPTON** (4-2, 3-0 MEAC) escaped with a 16-14 win at **Norfolk State** in the *Battle of the Bay Classic* as the Spartans' missed on a 25-yard field goal with a couple of minutes left. Norfolk State placekicker **Josh Nardone** was wide right on the field goal attempt that would have given the Spartans the lead.

Hampton built a 14-0 lead on two first-quarter **Shai McKenzie** short TD runs of 6 and 4 yards. NSU (2-4, 2-1) got a 52-yard TD pass from **Juan Carter** to **Marcus Taylor** early in the second quarter to trail 14-7 at the break.

The game-deciding points came midway thru the third quarter when NSU RB **Larry Bishop** was tackled in the Spartan end zone for a safety to put Hampton up 16-7. The play came right after Hampton was stopped at the NSU 1 on fourth down.

NSU closed to within 16-14 midway thru the fourth quarter when Carter and Taylor hooked up from 4 yards out. On the Spartans' next possession, they drove 48 yards in 10 plays to set up the field goal attempt that could have won the game.

• BCSP No. 1 **NORTH CAROLINA A&T** got three second-quarter TD passes from QB **Lamar Raynard** to break away from a 7-7 first quarter tie en route to downing **Florida A&M** at the Rattlers' homecoming, 31-20.

Raynard (20-32-2, 215 yards) connected on TD throws of 14 yards to **Jamari Smith**, 14 yards to **Xavier Griffin** and 4 yards to **Elijah Bell** in the second quarter while the Aggie defense shut out FAMU. A&T (7-0, 4-0 MEAC) led 28-7 at the half.

• BCSP No. 4 **ALCORN STATE** (5-2, 3-0 SWAC E) spotted **Prairie View A&M** a 14-0 first quarter lead and behind back-up QB **Noah Johnson** scored 24 unanswered second-quarter points in downing the Panthers 34-21.

Johnson scored on 8- and 2-yard runs and hit **Charles Hughes** on a 12-yard scoring pass just before halftime to put the Braves up 24-14.

Corey McCullough, who had a 39-yard field goal in the second quarter, hit on a 34-yarder in the third quarter followed by a 7-yard TD run from starting QB **Lenorris Footman** as the Braves scored 34 straight points.

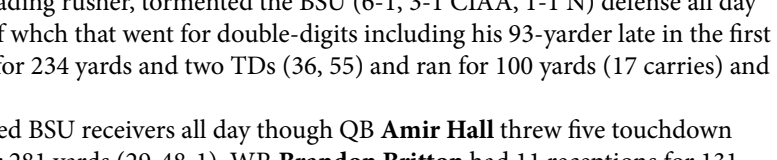
• BCSP No. 10 **HOWARD** (3-3, 2-1 MEAC) rushed for 286 yards and four TDs in spoiling **Delaware State's** homecoming, 52-23.

Howard freshman QB **Caylin Newton** ran for 81 yards and passed for 285 yards (16-21-1) and two TDs in the win. Senior LB **Elijah Anglin** had two sacks and returned a fumble 96 yards for a TD.

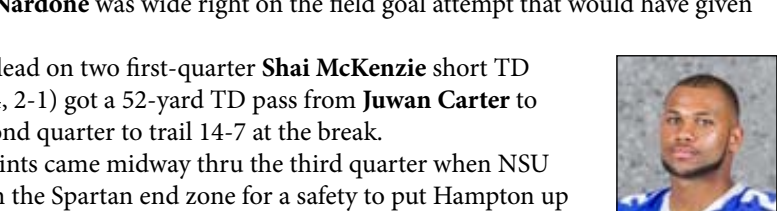
• **TUSKEGEE** (5-2, 3-1 SIAC) got its second win over a **SWAC** team as the Golden Tigers dominated **Jackson State**, 33-7, at the *Fifth Quarter Classic* in Mobile, Alabama.

TU rushed for 226 yards and passed for 253 while holding JSU (0-6, 0-2 SWAC) to just 117 total yards.

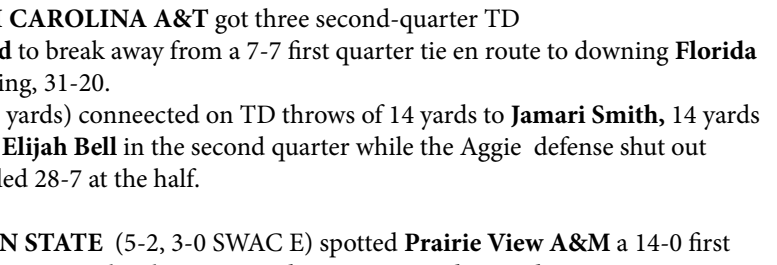

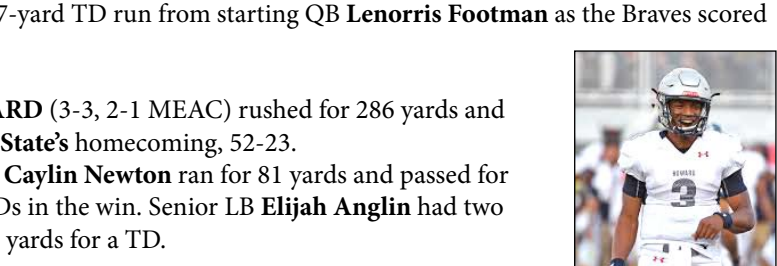
Virginia State RB **Trenton Cannon**



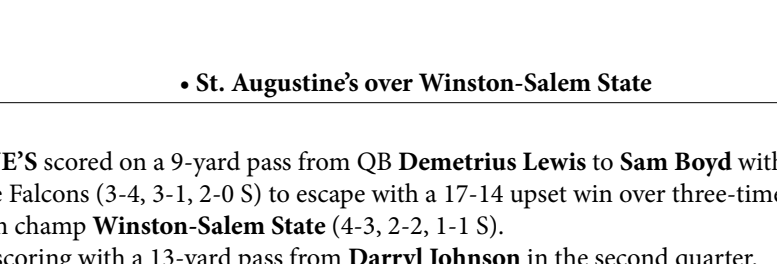
Hampton RB **Shai McKenzie**



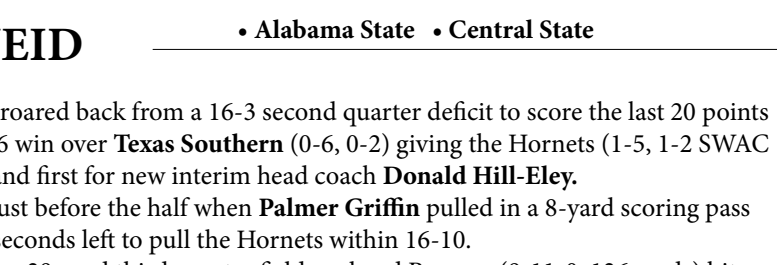

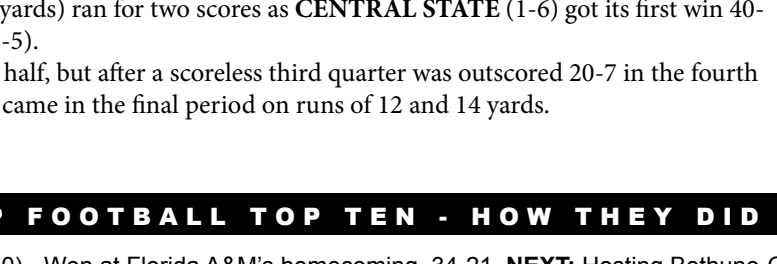

• St. Augustine's over Winston-Salem State

• **SAINT AUGUSTINE'S** scored on a 9-yard pass from QB **Demetrius Lewis** to **Sam Boyd** with :29 seconds left that allowed the Falcons (3-4, 3-1, 2-0 S) to escape with a 17-14 upset win over three-time defending **CIAA** South Division champ **Winston-Salem State** (4-3, 2-2, 1-1 S).

Boyd had opened the scoring with a 13-yard pass from **Darryl Johnson** in the second quarter. WSSU got a 35-yard pass from **Rod Tinsley** to **Canard Brown** to pull within 7-6 at the break. WSSU went up 14-7 in the third period on **Kerrion Moore's** 7-yard run before SAU's fourth quarter rally.

It began on **Sean Smith's** 30-yard field goal and culminated with Boyd's second TD reception. SAU had given up 66 points in a loss to **Bowie State** and scored 81 points in a win over **Lincoln**.

• **ALABAMA STATE** roared back from a 16-3 second quarter deficit to score the last 20 points of the game and pull out a 23-16 win over **Texas Southern** (0-6, 0-2) giving the Hornets (1-5, 1-2 SWAC E) their first win of the season and first for new interim head coach **Donald Hill-Eley**.

The comeback began just before the half when **Palmer Griffin** pulled in a 8-yard scoring pass from **Darryl Pearson** with :12 seconds left to pull the Hornets within 16-10.

Hunter Hanson hit on a 28-yard third quarter field goal and Pearson (9-11-0, 126 yards) hit **Willis White** with a 67-yard TD pass to give the Hornets' their first lead. Hanson connected from 40 yards out in the final period for the final margin.

• QB **Trent Mays** (20-36-0) threw for 334 yards and one TD and ran for one score while RB **Terraris Saffold** (21 carries, 87 yards) ran for two scores as **CENTRAL STATE** (1-6) got its first win 40-35 over **Arkansas-Pine Bluff** (2-5).

UAAP led 28-20 at the half, but after a scoreless third quarter and was outscored 20-7 in the fourth quarter. Both of Saffold's scores came in the final period on runs of 12 and 14 yards.

- **FIRST TO 2,000 PASSING YARDS** - **Bowie State** quarterback **Amir Hall** is the first HBCU passer to reach 2,000 yards this season. Hall threw for 281 yards in the Bulldogs' first loss of the season, 47-35 Saturday to **Virginia State**. Hall also threw five TD passes in the loss.



HALL: 281 more passing yards moves him past 2,000 for the 2017 season.

Through seven games, Hall now has 2,264 yards, tops in HBCU football and third in Div. II. His 29 TD passes tops black college and Div. II football.

- **FIRST TO 1,000 RUSHING YARDS** - **Alcorn State** running back **DeLance Turner** and **Trenton Cannon** of **Virginia State** are the closest rushers to reach the 1,000-yard mark this season.

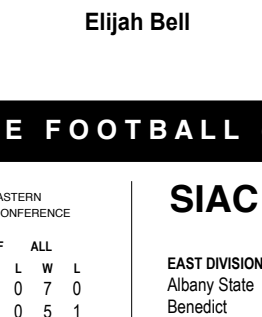
Turner leads the **SWAC** and **FCS** football in rushing with 788 yards thru seven games.



HALL: 281 more passing yards moves him past 2,000 for the 2017 season.

After six games, Cannon leads the **CIAA** and all of black college football with 863 yards and 143.8 yards per game. His 234 rushing yards in Saturday's win over **Bowie State** padded those stats.

- **FIRST TO 1,000 RECEIVING YARDS** - **Bowie State** wide receiver **Brandon Britton** and **North Carolina A&T** wideout **Elijah Bell** are the top producing wide receivers in black college football.



BELL: 675 receiving yards, 17th best in Div. II but tops in black college football.

Britton has 675 receiving yards, 17th best in Div. II but tops in black college football. His 11 TD receptions leads black college and Div. II football.

Bell has 575 receiving yards through seven games to lead the **MEAC**. His total is 19th in the **FCS**. Bell is second in the **FCS** and first in black college football with nine TD receptions.
