CIAA CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

• Player of the Year, senior running back **Trenton Cannon** ran for 186 yards and two long touchdowns in the second half to allow undefeated BCSP No. 3 **VIRGINIA STATE** to pull away to a 42-19 win over **Fayetteville State** before 3,766 fans at the **CIAA** Championship Game in Salem, Va.

The Trojans (10-0) jumped on the Broncos (6-5) early, converting an FSU fumble on the first play from scrimmage into a 10-yard Cannon touchown run less than four minutes into the game. VSU went on to score on its next two possessions on an 84-yard catch and run by WR **Zachary Parker** and a 5-yard pass from QB **Cordelral Cook** (10-16-0) to **Joshua Harris**, building a 21-0 first-quarter lead that stood until halftime.

FSU made it a game in the third quarter, cutting the lead to 21-7 on a 37-yard pass from freshman QB **Richard Latimer** (9-18-0, 154 yards) to **Curtis Burston**, and after a 26-yard scoring run by Cook (70 rushing yards), pulled to within 28-13 as RB **Stevie Green** (22 carries, 144 yards) scored on a 15-yard run with 5:36 left in the period.

But after being bottled up for 39 yards on 13 carries to that point, Cannon took over. He first scampered 73-yards to paydirt to increase the lead to 35-13 late in the third quarter. He then bettered that with a 79-yarder on VSU's second possession of the fourth quarter to all but put the game away. Burston scored on a 22-yard pass from back-up QB **Devin Knudsen** on the game's final play for the final margin.

Cannon also had 88 yards on kickoff returns and 33 yards on receptions to total a record 311 all-purpose yards and earn the game's MVP award. Senior LB **Brandon Lynch** led the VSU defense with 12 tackles, 1.5 sacks and 2 tackles for -12 yards in losses. Green won FSU's player of the game award.

The title was the 12th in VSU history and first for second-year head coach **Reggie Barlow**.

On the NCAA Div. II Selection Show Sunday, Virginia State received a 2nd-seed in Super Region II and will host 7th seed West Georgia (8-3) on Nov. 18 in a first round playoff game. **Bowie State** (9-1), who finished behind VSU in the CIAA North Division, was seeded 4th in the region and will host 5th-seed Delta State (8-3) on Saturday. West Alabama (9-1) is the top seed in the region.

SIAC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

• West Division champ **Tuskegee** (9-2) got two rushing touchdowns from RB **Hoderick Lowe** in the first and fourth quarters and the Golden Tigers' defense held East Division champion **Fort Valley State** to just two field goals in pulling out a 13-6 victory in the **SIAC** Championship Game played at the home of the East Division winners.

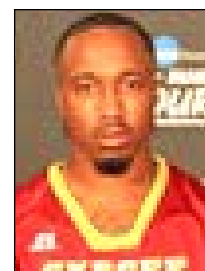
Lowe was the offensive star of the game running for 124 yards on 25 carries including scoring runs of 6 yards in the opening quarter and 5 yards midway thru the final period. The Tuskegee defense meanwhile kept the Wildcats (5-5) out the end zone led by LB **Osband Thompson's** 14 tackles and 12 from fellow LB **Kevin Dawson**.

The game was a grind-it-out affair with neither QB **Jamarcus Ezell** of Tuskegee (4-12-1, 55 yards) or FVSU's **Slade Jarman** (6-16-0, 38 yards) throwing for 100 yards or a touchdown.

Despite the win, the Golden Tigers were not awarded a berth in the NCAA Div. II playoffs when the 28-team field was announced Sunday.

BCSP No. 6 **Howard** and BCSP No. 5 **North Carolina Central** both had last-second finishes, one kept the Bison in the **MEAC title** race and one knocked the Eagles out of it.

- **HOWARD** scored on a 2-yard run by QB **Caylin Newton** with just :05 seconds left to complete a 10-point fourth-quarter comeback and pull out a 28-24 home win over **Norfolk State** to keep their **MEAC** title hopes alive.

Howard (7-3, 6-1 MEAC) in its first year under head coach **Mike London**, picked to finish eighth in the preseason, trailed 24-14 entering the fourth quarter and appeared about to go down by more before back-up NSU QB **Tripp Harrington** was picked off in the Howard end zone by Bison DB **Bryan Cook**, his second pick of the game. The Bison then drove 90 plays in nine plays, the key play being a 59-yard run by Bison RB **Anthony Philyaw** (20 carries, 193 yards). The drive was capped by **Dezmond Wortham's** 3-yard run that cut the lead to 24-21 with 8:06 to play.

On the ensuing possession after getting two first downs, NSU punted to Howard. The Bison started their final drive at their own 11 with four minutes to play and needed 12 plays to cover the 89 yards before Newton (9-16-1, 159 passing yards, 18 carries, 46 yards, 1 TD) reached paydirt from the 2 with five ticks left. The freshman QB carried six times for 41 yards in the game-winning drive.

Philyaw had opened the scoring on a 7-yard run that followed the game's first turnover, a fumble by NSU starting QB **Juan Carter** on the Spartan's first possession forced by **Aaron Motley** and recovered by Howard DB **Devin Rollins** at the NSU 27. NSU scored the next three TDs as **Aaron Savage** scored on a 5-yard jaunt, Carter (21-35-1, 257 passing yards, 1 TD, 20 rushing yards 1 TD) ran two yards for a score and hit **Demetreus Ferebee** for a 19-yard TD. **Josh Nardone's** 27-yard field goal :27 seconds before the half sent the Spartans into the break up 24-14. It stayed that way until the fourth quarter fireworks.

- BCSP No. 9 **Bethune-Cookman** scored on a Hail Mary pass on the final play of the game to pull out an improbable 13-10 win over **N. C. Central** to dash the Eagles' hopes for a fourth-straight MEAC title.

After trailing most of the game, **NCCU** (7-3, 5-2 MEAC) scored on a 4th-down, 4-yard pass from QB **Chauncey Caldwell** (14-32-1, 100 yards) to **Xavier McCoy** with :16 seconds to play to go up 10-7. Caldwell ran 21 times for 148 yards in the game.

The dramatic game-winner came after B-CU's **Keavon Mitchell** returned the ensuing kickoff to the NCCU 48. After an incompleteness on first down, B-CU QB **Larry Brihm's** pass into the end zone was deflected into the hands of Mitchell as time expired setting off a wild celebration by the Wildcats (6-4, 5-2).

The teams had battled to a 0-0 halftime tie before B-CU went up 7-0 on a 1-yard run by back-up QB **Akevious Williams** with 3:44 left in the third period. The Eagles responded with a 14-play, 82-yard drive that carried to the B-CU before they settled for a 22-yard **Aedan Johnson** field goal to cut the lead to 7-3 with 13:19 left in the final period. It stayed that way until the Eagles drove 61 yards in 15 plays to score on McCoy's 4th-down TD reception. The drive was kept alive by a pass interference call on 4th-down earlier in the drive by B-CU DB **Elliot Miller**. Caldwell hit McCoy six plays later to give the Eagles the lead.

- BCSP No. 7 **ALCORN STATE** ran for 424 yards and 5 TDs to clinch its fourth straight **SWAC** East Division title and spot in the Dec. 2 league championship game as they shut out **Mississippi Valley State**, 59-0. RB **De'Lance Turner** ran for 173 yards and 2 TDs (36, 1), QB **Noah Johnson** had 122 yards and 2 scores (37, 33) and **P. J. Simmons** had 97 yards and one score (27). Johnson also passed for 297 yards (12-19-1) and three scores, all to WR **Norlando Veals** (17, 62, 66) as the Braves (7-3, 5-1 SWAC E) put up 748 yards of total offense. Veals had nine receptions for 253 yards.

- QB **Lamar Raynard** (17-27-0) threw for 252 yards and 2 TDs (54, 18) and RB **Marquell Cartwright** ran for 127 yards (27 carries) and two scores (1, 1) as BCSP No. 1 **NORTH CAROLINA A&T** stayed unbeaten (10-0, 7-0 MEAC) and clinched a share of the **MEAC** championship with a 36-17 home win over **Savannah State**. A&T placekicker **Noell Ruiz** added field goals of 25, 30 and 32 yards in the win. The Aggies can win the MEAC title outright with a win next week vs. rival **North Carolina Central**.

- BCSP No. 2 **GRAMBLING STATE** got two passing touchdowns from QB **Devante Kincade** (7, 44) and a rushing TD from RB **Martez Carter** in a 24-7 win at **Alabama State** that clinched for the G-MEN (9-1, 6-0 SWAC W) a share of the **SWAC** West Division title with a showdown for the outright title set for Nov. 25 vs. **Southern** at the New Orleans SuperDome.

- BCSP No. 8 **SOUTHERN** (7-3, 5-1 SWAC W) kept pace with Grambling, scoring a 33-7 win at **Texas Southern** to set up the showdown with Grambling at the *Bayou Classic* for the **SWAC** West crown. Southern QB **Austin Howard** (23-34-0, 203 yards) had one TD throw while RB **Herbert Edwards** ran 18 times for 159 yards including a 71-yard TD scamper that opened the scoring late in the first quarter.

CIAA PLAYERS OF THE YEAR AND ALL-CONFERENCE TEAMS

– The **Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA)**, with its Football Coaches Association and Sports Information Directors Association, released the 2017 All-CIAA First, Second Teams, players and coach of the year.

Trenton Cannon of **Virginia State**, **Sterling Hammond** of **Virginia Union** and **Gene Carson** of **Bowie State** highlight the teams as the conference's most outstanding players while VSU head coach **Reggie Barlow** won the Coach of the Year award.

Cannon earned Offensive Player of the Year leading the CIAA in overall rushing yards this season (1,387) and rushing yards per game (154.1). He also produced 14 touchdowns on the season. Out of the ten-week regular season, the Hampton, VA native earned five Offensive Back of the Week honors. Cannon and the Trojans have secured the Northern Division Title and competed in the 2017 CIAA Football Championship.

CIAA Defensive Player of the Year has been awarded to Sterling Hammond a senior defensive back at Virginia Union. Hammond finished the season ranked first in the conference with 5 interceptions. He tallied 70 total tackles, including 46 solo tackles. The Caret, Virginia native earned CIAA Defensive Back of the Week on two occasions this season.

Gene Carson, Bowie State University's sophomore kicker, has been named Special Teams Player of the Year. Carson scored 102 points for the Bulldogs this season, completing 10-13 (77%) field goals and 72-77 (94%) extra point attempts.

Throughout the season, Virginia State topped the rankings in the North, advanced to the 2017 CIAA Football Championship where the Trojans defeated **Fayetteville State** Saturday, 49-13. VSU also was ranked nationally in the Top 25 of Div. II and finished as the No. 2 seeded team in Super Region II of Div. II

Offensively, Virginia State averaged 47.3 points per conference game while marking 235.0 passing and 278.4 rushing yards.
